Descriptions

Week 1: Vision, History and Philosophy

To build the Kingdom of heaven a community must have direction that is given from heaven. In this first session we will learn the history of Be One Ministries and its founders. They will get to know the vision or purpose of this ministry. Finally, participants will be taught the *halacha* or way in which we walk out our vision. The philosophy will be a great bridge for a person to understand the differences between Be One and other ministries.

We will also provide an understanding of the structure or government of Be One. Each organization has a structure and the clarity of this brings comfort and strength to its members. We cover the Biblical model that we follow from the book of Acts. Our practice is based on ancient ways that began in the deserts of Egypt and have carried through Messiah to now.

Week 2: Essential Doctrines & dealing with the non-essentials

In essentials unity, in non-essentials liberty, in all things love.

This week we go through the Be One essential beliefs. The core of who we are must be Biblical and all leaders must agree to these standards. Non-Essentials (Bible Doctrine)

Here we discover several Bible doctrines that are dear to many but not to all. We discuss how to handle those differences. We also cover the unique doctrines and lines of thought that seem to find their way into Messianic Jewish ministries. Most importantly we begin to learn how to deal with people and their differences in our groups.

Week 3: Intro to the Biblical Roi (Shepherd): The Four Pillars

Be One Fellowship trains each Roi (Shepherd). A good leader is as concerned about what they draw out of a person as to what they put into a person. This session will teach the reason behind our model of ministry. We will introduce the four pillars.

Week 4: Powerful Assumptions

Everyone has assumptions. In this session we learn what assumptions are and discover how G-d uses this to help us shepherd people with the right heart and tactics.

Week 5: Cultivating Questions

The Hebraic Way has always been to ask questions. Learning how to cultivate good questions and then to give them out is a skill that anyone can learn and craft everyone should desire.

Week 6: Engaged Listening

A quality of every *Roi* is to be a good listener. A good listener is someone who hears with understanding and heart rather than agenda. Each Fellowship group will have a dynamic based on its individual makeup. Engaged listening will model love and provide a place for everyone to be drawn into fellowship.

Week 7: Insightful Reflection

"Opinions, opinions," as one person said, "are like armpits, everyone has a couple, and they stink." A strong *roi* knows the difference between an opinion and an observation. Learning the power of discernment will bring great comfort to each fellowship.

Week 8: Commissioning

The journey now begins. We conclude our training with a graduation and commissioning with the laying on of hands and prayer.
